PRIVACY POLICY

Thank you for visiting iahp.org. Your privacy is important to us. As such, we provide this statement explaining our online information practices and the choices you can make about the way your personal information is collected and used at iahp.org.

THE INFORMATION WE COLLECT

At iahp.org, you can subscribe to the eNewsletter and various other services from the IAHP, access and interact with “members only” content, and submit various inquiries and requests. We often seek to collect from you various forms of personal information, especially to become a registered member and access “members only” content.

Examples of the types of Personally Identifiable Information (hereafter referred to as “PII”) that may be collected on these pages include: name, street address, e-mail address, telephone number, fax number, information about your interests in and use of various products, programs, and services. Not all is mandatory though some is encouraged for the purposes of exchanging feedback and improve our services. Persons who wish to become registered members and access and/or contribute to “members only” content will be required to submit basic information such as full names and e-mail addresses.

The Gentle Revolution Press (the for-profit book and materials distributor for the IAHP) may also ask for credit card information (as well as information regarding your interests in various products, programs, and services) if you purchase any products from the Gentle Revolution Press website. IAHP.org may share your personal information with The Gentle Revolution Press. From time to time you may be able to submit information about other people, in situations such as referrals, product offerings, and other times when contacting other people is necessary. Examples of the types of PII we can collect about other people include name, street address, e-mail address, and telephone number. Our service providers, our partners, and we may collect various types of non-personally identifiable information (“non-PII”) when you visit any of our sites. A representative list of the types of non-PII we may collect include: current Internet Protocol (IP) address, type of browser you are using (e.g. Firefox, Internet Explorer, or Safari), the type of operating system you are using (e.g. Windows or Mac OS), the domain name of your Internet service provider (e.g. Comcast or Verizon), the web pages you have visited within our site, the content you have accessed within our site, and the advertisements you have been shown and/or have clicked on.

HOW WE USE THE INFORMATION

We may use the information you provide about yourself to fulfill your requests, respond to your inquiries, offer you products or services that we believe may be applicable to you or the people whose information you have submitted, enforce the legal terms that govern your use of our site and its content, and/or use it for other stated purposes for which you provide the information. We sometimes use this information to communicate with you about your member account, and to

notify you about policy changes. From time to time, we may also use this information in combination with other sources of information about you to fulfill our ability to provide our products and services. We sometimes use non-PII to improve the content, design, and performance of our sites, to analyze usage of our sites, to deliver relevant advertisements and marketing messages, and to personalize your site experience.

INFORMATION SHARING AND DISCLOSURE

We may disclose PII in response to legal process, for example, in response to a court order or subpoena. We also may disclose such information in response to a law enforcement agency's request, or when we believe it is necessary to investigate, prevent, or take action regarding illegal activities, suspected fraud, potential threats to the physical safety of any person, violations of our Terms Of Use, to verify or enforce compliance with the policies governing our sites and applicable laws or as otherwise required or permitted by law or consistent with legal requirements. Our agents and contractors who have access to PII are required to protect this information in a manner that is consistent with this privacy statement by, for example, not using the information for any purpose other than to carry out the services they are performing for us. Although we take appropriate measures to safeguard against unauthorized disclosures of information, we cannot assure you that PII we collect will never be disclosed in a manner that is inconsistent with this privacy statement. We may disclose PII to third parties whose practices are not covered by this privacy statement (e.g. other marketers, publishers, retailers, participatory databases, and non-profit organizations) that want to market products or services to you. If you have signed up to receive our e-mails and prefer not to receive updates from this site, follow the "unsubscribe" instructions provided on any periodical e-mail you receive from this site.
